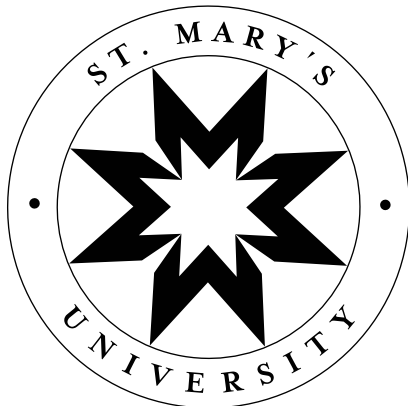


MINORS AND DISCIPLINES OFFERED

CENTER FOR LEARNING, ACCESS AND STUDENT SUCCESS (CLASS)

St. Mary's University is committed to providing an inclusive and accessible academic experience that supports the learning and development of all students. The Centre for Learning, Access and Student Success (CLASS) provides academic supports on campus and online. All services and resources offered through CLASS are free and open to all St. Mary's University students.

What services and supports are offered through CLASS?

- A peer mentor space where students can meet with fellow students to gain insight on navigating course content and expectations from a student perspective
- A study space equipped with computers, scanners and printers for student use
- Access to the Academic Access Coordinator who works with students with disabilities to develop accommodation plans and is also available to assist any student who wishes to discuss academic concerns and explore academic strategies for success
- A testing center for accommodated exams and external proctoring
- A Writing Centre with drop-in labs where students can work on written assignments with the support of our academic writing instructors.
- *Chat with a Prof* program where students can access writing support online from our academic writing instructors
- Success Strategies Series (S³eminars) designed to strengthen skills in the areas of academic writing, wellness and career readiness

What is the best way for prospective students to get in contact with CLASS?

New students requesting accommodation for a disability should contact the Academic Access Coordinator prior to the semester start. Accommodations may be requested or revised throughout the academic year for students experiencing temporary conditions, or changes to their disability status or impacts. Accommodation requests must be supported with appropriate documentation, obtained from a licensed professional experienced in the diagnosis and treatment of the respective disability.

INDIGENOUS INITIATIVES

The aim and goal of Indigenous Initiatives at St. Mary's University is two-fold:

Firstly, it is about education. At St. Mary's University we focus on bringing Indigenous knowledge and worldviews into the university. Students can engage academically in Indigenous courses for credit as well as inter-disciplinary curriculum collaborative opportunities with Indigenous scholars and Elders. Education also takes place through community engagement opportunities such as Beading, Bannock & Banter, Indigenous Voices (centering Indigenous Elders and Scholars voices in the academy - partnering with the City of Calgary), Elder Coffee and Conversations, Tipi raising for special events, and more! These events and opportunities are open to all.

Secondly, it is also about creating a space at StMU that Indigenous learners feel welcomed, supported and a sense of belonging.





Stories about the tipi were very interesting, allowing for a more holistic picture that brought together different elements of Indigenous culture. Reg and Rose discussed the process of building a tipi, as well as the story behind the paintings on the tipi, and its significance to the people. Through the entirety of the event all attendees were seated in chairs or on the grass inside the tipis. It was an amazing opportunity to learn from Elders Reg and Rose in a manner that aligned with Indigenous traditions of oral literacy and smudging while in circle. The entire event was conducted with as much Indigenous tradition as possible, and the presence of the Crowshoes' tipis assisted in this.

What opportunities are there to engage with Indigenous Initiatives on campus?

Students can get engaged with the Indigenous student body at StMU and have a voice and say in programming they would like to see to support their learning journey. The Indigenous Initiatives office is always a welcoming place where students can smudge, visit with other students, find out about what's happening in community and reach out for support. We host Elders on campus regularly and students can also request a one on one meeting with an Elder. Academic supports are also available to our Indigenous students and can be accessed through the Indigenous Initiatives office. Students also have the opportunity to get involved in the StMU response to the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action through the Truth and Reconciliation Working Group which is led by our Elder Grandmother Doreen Spence. We are also so blessed to have our Elders Casey Eagle Speaker, Evelyn Good Striker and Edmee Comstock who work closely with the StMU community.

- Inter-faith community service projects – building respect and tolerance by serving our neighborhood together

- Weekly Masses and sacramental ministries – Fr. Peter Doherty is our priest on faculty available for spiritual counseling. We also have pastors who join us on campus to celebrate at Wednesday Mass.

EXPERIENTIAL TRAVEL STUDY & INTERNATIONAL LEARNING

Experiential learning (EL) is learning-by-doing that bridges knowledge and experience through critical reflection. EL activities are intentionally designed and assessed to empower learners by enhancing individual and collaborative skills such as complex problem solving, professional practice skills, and teamwork. Reflecting critically on these activities helps individuals develop higher order thinking to challenge and advance their perspectives. EL prepares students to take on roles as active citizens and thrive in an increasingly complex and globalized society.

INVESTING IN YOUR EDUCATION AT ST. MARY'S UNIVERSITY

President's Circle Scholarships

To recognize and reward the academic achievement that students earn in high school, through the admission process, St. Mary's University automatically grants high school applicants with the President's Circle Scholarship. APPLYING TO ST. MARY'S UNIVERSITY

Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science programs

Admission based on high school standing

Applicants in this category must have received a high school diploma and must have an average of at least 65 per cent on five 30-level subjects listed. No subject with a mark below 50 per cent may be used.

If missing one of the required subjects or if the admission average is between 60 – 64.9 per cent, an applicant may be considered under the Special Admission category on a case-by-case basis.

1. English Language Arts 30-1 or ENGL 030 (St. Mary's University equivalent of 30-1)
Note: Applicants who present a final grade below 65 percent in English 30-1 will be required to take WRIT 201 (3 credits) during their first semester of studies.
2. One of:
 - Mathematics 30-1, Mathematics 30-2 or MATH 030 (St. Mary's University equivalent of Mathematics 30-1). Note: Mathematics 31 does not satisfy this requirement.
 - 30-level language other than English
3. Two of:
 - Aboriginal Studies 30 (5 credits)
 - Biology 30
 - Chemistry 30
 - 30-level language other than English
 - Mathematics 30-1, Mathematics 30-2 or MATH 030 (if not used to satisfy requirement #2)
 - Mathematics 31
 - Physics 30
 - Science 30
 - Social Studies 30-1
4. One additional approved 5-credit or two 3-credit subjects at the 30-level (excluding Special Projects 30)

Note: Two subjects in the same discipline may not normally be presented to satisfy admission requirements. Exceptions are Mathematics 30-1 and Mathematics 31, and languages other than English. No course with a mark below 50 percent may be used.

Applicants to the following programs will adhere to the same admission requirements as for High School Standing, but must successfully complete:

Bachelor of Science, 4-year Biology Degree

- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30
- Mathematics 30-1 or equivalent

If deemed inadmissible to the Bachelor of Science program, admission will automatically be deferred to the Open Studies program.

Business Transfer Program

One of:

- Mathematics 30-1 or equivalent
- Mathematics 30-2 or equivalent

Or, if transferring to the University of Calgary:

- Mathematics 30-1 or equivalent

Psychology Degree Program

One of:

- Mathematics 30-1 or equivalent
- Mathematics 30-2 or equivalent

If you do not meet the criteria above, you may be admissible under one of our other admissions categories. You can find complete admissions details for all programs in the University Academic Calendar which can be found at stmu.ca.

Bachelor of Education Single-Entry program

Our Single-Entry program offers students acceptance into a Bachelor of Arts or Science degree AND a Bachelor of Education program at the same time. To be eligible for the Single-Entry program, students must:

- Be entering directly from high school, and applying to the university in their year of graduation
- Meet regular Bachelor of Arts or Science admissions requirements with an average of at least 75 per cent

Submit:

- Three professional or academic references that speak to the applicant's capacity as a worker, learner, and leader.
- A resume outlining all relevant work and volunteer experience with children and youth.

Bachelor of Education programs

All applicants must submit:

- 3 professional or academic references that speak to the applicant's capacity as a worker, learner, and leader.
- A resume outlining all relevant work and volunteer experience with children and youth.

Academic requirements differ by program:

ELEMENTARY

- 3- or 4-year Bachelor's degree, including the following course completion:
 - 2 English courses
 - 1 Math course
 - 1 Science course
 - 1 Social Studies course
- minimum 2.5 GPA on last 30 credits

SECONDARY

- 4-year Bachelor's degree, including the following course completion:
 - 2 English or French Literature courses
- minimum 2.5 GPA on last 30 credits

Students must select a teaching stream upon application to the Bachelor of Education, Secondary degree program. Additional academic requirements differ by teaching stream:
