

# Introduction to Mosaics

Mosaics are one of the more durable and eloquent forms of human art. During the earliest centuries of Christianity, mosaics were the primary art form for conveying biblical stories and the lives of saints. Examples of this ancient and powerful art form can still be seen today in cities such as Ravenna.

This course enables students to learn the skills employed in creating such enduring masterpieces and delight in creating their own piece of art history. Students will learn how to cut and lay tiles to create personalized compositions. This informative class covers cutting, proper adhesives, substrates, design/layout and grouting, which will enable students to complete their own project.

Jody (Martin) Krauss has been a stained glass maker and repairer for many years, specializing particularly in the restoration of historic church stained glass windows. She is currently completing a two-year restoration project with Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Calgary, as well as several other projects with windows that are over 100 years old.
