St. Mary's University College Drama Present's "A Wilder Evening: Two Plays by Thorton Wilder"

Calgary, AB (March 26, 2013) – Drama students at St. Mary's University College explore the universal human experience with great humour and pathos, posing timeless questions about the meaning of love, life and death in their upcoming production of Thorton Wilder's *Our Town*.

In this tale about life in the mystical village of Grover's Corners, New Hampshire, an ensemble cast of nineteen students and two stage managers explore the lives of people living in a small, quintessentially American town.

Drama students will also put on Wilder's delightful one-act, *Queens of France* directed by Lindsay Dawn Tingley, veteran of the St Mary's Drama Program.

"Ultimately, *Our Town* inspires us to appreciate each moment of our daily lives; to know how precious each moment and each person in our lives truly is," said Drama Instructor Joe-Norman Shaw. "It's an important message for our busy times- one we hope that everyone will take to heart."

Joe-Norman Shaw, an acclaimed actor/director and co-founder of Company of Rogues Actors Studio in Calgary, has worked with an eager contingent of students since assuming the role of drama instructor at St. Mary's in September 2011.

"This is my second year as Director of the St Mary's Drama Program and it's been exciting to build on the momentum of last year's production of Tina Howe's *Museum*," he said. "My vision for this program is to provide students with some practical hands-on experience of the acting process in the fall term that they can apply to a Winter Production for a live audience."

A Wilder Evening Opens Tuesday, April 2 at 7:00pm in Fr. Michael J. McGivney Hall on the St. Mary's University College campus, 14500 Bannister Road SE. The production offers a performance on Wednesday, April  $3^{rd}$  and Thursday, April  $4^{th}$  at 7:00pm as well.
